We looked at the character 好

And the way it's composed of two components put close together so that they take up the same amount of space as a 1-component character: 女 which, on its own means 'female' and 子 which, on its own, represents 'child'.

We learnt to pronounce the characters from 1 – 5

We also learnt to recognise the character that means 'work' 工 and one which means 'king': 王
