Wǒ = I

Shì = am (the verb 'to be')

Nǐ hǎo!  
you → Nǐ      hǎo → good

= hello!

Nǐ hǎo ma?  
How are you?

question mark

Wǒ hěn hǎo, xièxiè  
very → hěn      Thanks → xièxiè

I'm fine thanks

The marks over some vowels are called "tone marks". They're very helpful as they show the rise/fall (tone) of your voice. There are 4 tones in Mandarin (plus a neutral tone).

Pinyin is a way of writing Chinese with our alphabet. Chinese characters represent meaning - not sound. Here are two characters for numbers one → four:
